| PO 404 Prepared Music <Critical> | <p>Prepared Music - Select one song from each list:</p> <p>List A: Echoing Sticks or Drum Oddity</p> <p>List B: Solo #17 or Bobbin Back or Rolling Accents or Phantom Drummer</p> <p>List C: Gymnopedie</p> |
| PO 405 Ensemble <Critical> | <p>Suggested Repertoire for Ensemble:</p> <p>Concert - Air for Band (Erickson), El Mirador (Chatman), Legend (De! Borgo), Three Ayres from Gloucester (Stuart); or</p> <p>Parade - General Salute, Advance; or March - Heart of Oak, PPCLI, RCAF, Military Escort, Eagle Squadron</p> |
| PO 406 Sight Reading <Critical> | <p>Will perform without help a musical selection no greater than 16 bars in length. The selection will be of a technical difficulty equivalent to one level below the musician level being tested. Given a brief period to look at the music and determine musical requirements of selection.</p> <p>Play music at appropriate skill level for the piece selected demonstrating: a) attention to notation and other directions for performance, b) an acceptable grasp of the style of the given music; and c) an ability to recognize and correct any errors made in the initial reading</p> |
| PO 407 Ear Tests <Critical> | Sing, clap or tap the rhythm (only) of a short melody after it has been played twice by the instructor. Time Signature: 2/4 and 6/8 |
| PO 408 Music Theory <Critical> | Demonstrate an understanding of Music Theory to include: Chords, Naming the Keys of Melodies without Key Signatures, Transposition, Cadences, and Correction of Errors to the standard of 60%. Reference is Lawless, Grade 1 Theory (Waterloo, 1994), complete. Alternate reference is Ecole de Musique Vincent D'Indy, Theorie de la Musique. |
| PO 409 Band Drill <Critical> | Skilled at band drill. The level of proficiency necessary to independently perform and demonstrate band drill to instrument drill for two sections of the band, mace and bass drum signals. |
| PO 410 Conducting <Critical> | Demonstrate a limited skill at conducting a small group utilizing the following time signature: 2/4, 3/4, 4/4 and 6/8 with or without pick ups. Demonstrate the proper use of the preparatory beat and the release |
